

English Phonetics and Phonology 2 – Practical classes

Requirements to pass the course

- **Attendance 75%** – bring certificate when necessary
- **Oral Practice** > Lab Practice : **ALL** the practice must be done in the lab (**NOT at home**) (see # 7. [Práctica libre en el laboratorio \(this site\)](#) for uploaded material and links and see #5 [Archivos Varios](#) to download the LAB sheet)

The material is organised in a monthly schedule that you are expected to respect. The aim of the lab practice is that you can have more opportunities to keep working on both pronunciation and the features of intonation. This part of the learning process is also aimed at developing autonomy so we expect you to do your work in a responsible way: take your time to record yourselves, do the repetition activities as many times as you need, listen to each other's recordings, etc.

- **Written Practice** > Transcriptions to hand in monthly – transcriptions **MUST be checked** before you hand in. **Please use another colour to mark your mistakes.** (see # 7. [Práctica escrita \(this site\)](#) for uploaded material)

- Those students who have more than 7 mistakes in the diagnostic written test must do 8.2 - 8.4 - 8.5 – 8.6 from English transcription course as extra practice to be handed in the 1st week of May.
